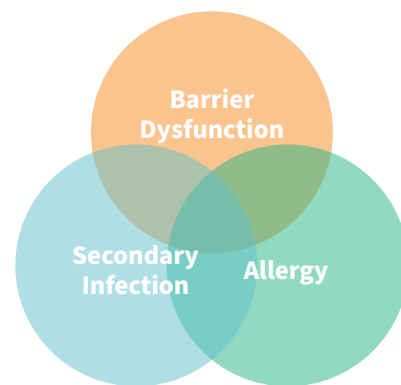


Allergic Skin Disease

Allergic dermatitis is an ongoing condition, however, once we establish the basic 'toolkit' required for your pet, we can achieve reasonable control of your pets' itch levels. Ongoing maintenance is required and seasonal flare-ups are to be expected, however, the degree of the flares should be more manageable.

Allergic dermatitis is the interaction of three components: the inciting allergy, a weak skin barrier, and secondary infection (overgrowth of the normal bugs on the skin). Addressing all three areas is required for a good outcome.
